

SAMPLE HOMESCHOOL SCHEDULES

HOW TO USE:

- The schedule can be customizable and adjust to your needs and timeframes.
- This is just a basic structure to experiment with and make your own.
- Use time blocking to create your ideal schedule. This general routine can work for all ages.
- Create a routine that you can follow 3-5 days a week for consistency in your homeschool.

EXAMPLE 1

8:00am-8:30am	Breakfast
8:30am-10:00am	Morning Routine (Ex.: Math, Language Arts, Read Aloud)
10:00am - 11:00am	Break, Snack + Get the Wiggles Out (Break time may be a good time for a few minutes of free play, or a game that the children could play while you complete a few chores or situate lunch preparation)
11:00am - 12:00pm	Science and/or History
12:00pm - 1:00pm	Lunch + Outside Play
1:00pm - 2:00pm	Looping Hour (Mix up each day with a variety of Art, Music, Nature Study, Hands-On Projects, Other Areas of Study that Don't Fit Into the Basic Subjects or that you want to spend extra time learning about)

EXAMPLE 2

8:30am-9:00am	Breakfast
9:00am-9:45am	Nature Walk & Study/Journaling
9:45am-10:15am	Chores & Prepare for Homeschool
10:15am - 11:15am	Unit Study Dive into a Particular area of study and integrate various subjects all in to this same area. Ex. Unit Study about Rocks can be done with Geology, Science, History, Use Rocks as Math Manipulatives, Calculate the Weight Differences of Various Rocks, Study Famous Geologists, Create Drawings of Various Types of Stones & Gems, Look Up Fun Rock and Geology Projects to Do at Home, Write Stories About Your Findings, Copy Work and Vocabulary with Words Related to Your Studies and Findings. The possibilities of a unit study are endless.
11:15am - 12:15pm	Lunch + Outside Play
12:15pm - 1:15pm	Work on Unit Study
1:15pm	Work at Home is Complete

EXAMPLE 3

1:00pm-2:00pm	Lunch & Outside Play
2:00pm - 2:30pm	History
2:30pm - 3:00pm	Math
3:00pm - 4:00pm	Language Arts
4:00pm - 4:15pm	Break, Snack, and Wiggles Out
4:15pm - 4:45pm	Science
4:45pm - 5:30pm	Art/Music/ Extra Studies

* Morning is used for chores, errands, or part-time/work-from-home work.
